New strata laws now operating




Just a reminder that not only did the new Acts take effect from 30 November but the new Strata Schemes Development Regulation 2016 also commenced. All together the Strata Schemes Development Act 2015 ('the Act') and the Strata Schemes Management Act 2015 and the Regulation brings major reform to the NSW strata laws.

Remember if you need any assistance NSW Fair Trading is only too willing to give you advice and support.

In addition, the office of the Registrar General has released a circular about the key changes that were made to the Regulation after all submissions regarding the draft were closed earlier this year. We have posted the circular on our website here that explains those changes.

SCA (NSW) Members manage 75% of lots in NSW



Did you know that as at 30 November there were 815,509 strata lots registered in NSW? That's an increase of 7,133 lots since we last brought you the strata data in September and includes all forms of strata title - residential, commercial, utility, car spaces etc.

What members may not know is that collectively you manage 596,346 lots which is 73 percent of the total lots in NSW.

We are proud to represent our strata manager members who manage almost three quarters (75 percent) of strata titled properties in this state. With these sorts of numbers behind us, together with strata owners as members, we have a strong voice when it comes to dealing with all levels of government.

Govt Response to Independent Review of Swimming Pool Regulations



The NSW Government has released its report into the effectiveness of the swimming pool barrier regulatory framework following an independent review which commenced in 2015.

The report made 62 recommendations which the Minister for Local Government, Paul O'Toole says are currently being considered.

In the meantime, the Government together with the Royal Life Saving Society NSW, is running an awareness campaign about the dangers of leaving children unsupervised around swimming pools. You may have already seen some TV advertising.

Environmental performance - Building operations grant

Provides support for buildings in the Sydney area to reduce water consumption. Solutions include sub-meters and water monitoring devices to track water use, identify water leaks and reduce water consumption costs.

Environmental performance - Ratings and assessment grant

Supports organisations and residential apartment communities to undertake energy ratings and audits for the first time. The cost of first-year energy assessments can be a significant barrier to organisations and this funding seeks to address this cost.

Successful applicants must commit to implement efficiency recommendations up to a certain value.

Funding is available in 3 categories:

- NABERS energy ratings.
- · Energy audits.
- Residential apartments water and/or energy assessments.

NCAT Getting Ready for the New Strata Laws



As of the 30th of November 2016, all strata applications will be listed for hearing before a Tribunal Member. Applications under the previous Act were generally determined on the papers.

This major change to NCAT's dispute resolution processes will provide a faster, simpler and clearer process for dealing with strata disputes.

The new Act also gives the Tribunal a number of new powers. These include making orders to comply with by-laws and imposing higher financial penalties on those who do not abide by the by-laws.

Any applications received **before 30 November 2016** will be dealt with under the old *Strata Schemes Management Act 1996*.

Applications received **on or after 30 November** will be dealt with under the new Act.
